The Study Mobility Process

Students who are part of the full-time or combined study programme are able to participate in the Erasmus Study Abroad Program. Students cannot participate if they are in the final semester of their degree.

The Application Process

Fill in the application form and submit a CV and Cover Letter, (in the language to be studied in), as well as a proof of language proficiency certificate – at least level B2 – if they have one (this isn't mandatory). The application form can be found here:

The Selection Process

- 1. Language Test applicants will be invited to take a Language Test at VSFS to verify their language skills. The test results will go towards calculating their score.
- 2. Grade-point average, tuition payment, etc. of the applicant will be submitted for review from various VSFS departments.
- 3. Interview If applicants receive a passing grade in the Language Test, they will be invited for an interview. They must bring a proposal Proof of Recognition document completed to show the courses from their preferred receiving university matched to courses from their study plan at VSFS. If an applicant has more than one partner in mind, they need to produce a proposed Proof of Recognition for each partner.
- 4. The Selection committee will calculate the applicants' scores according to how they performed in all of the above activities.
- 5. The Selection Committee will allocate the partner universities to the successful candidates.

After Selection

- 1. When the candidate has been nominated to the partner university, they must submit an application to the partner themselves.
- 2. Candidates then need to submit the required documentation to the VSFS Erasmus+ and Programmes Office.
- 3. When candidates complete these documents, they need to make sure that it reflects a minimum of 15 matching ECTS VSFS credits, and a total of 30 ECTS credits in total per semester.

Returning from Mobility

Students need to complete additional documentation for when they return in order to receive the final 30% of their Erasmus Grant.

Upon return, students are required to fulfil their individual study plans.

Language Requirements:

A very good command of English language (generally European level: minimum B2) is requested. A language evaluation (by phone, prior to final decision of acceptance) might be organized if necessary. Besides the courses offered in English for the guest students (see the list of modules taught in English), the majority of courses are given in French. Therefore, it is strongly recommended that you have a good command of the French language, both written and spoken, before you actually begin your study period at EPHEC, if your course programme includes courses taught in French.

Accommodation:

EPHEC does not own student dormitories, halls of residence or flats.

So you will need to find accommodation in the private sector: rented flats, sharing a room with families or other students. Previous exchange students from your institution might give you some useful hints, so it is always wise to refer to their former experience.

Renting a student room or flat in Brussels will cost on average 350-450 € per month.

You might need to sign a contract and pay a 2 months deposit with your landlord, renting contracts mostly for minimum 5 months.

Courses are offered in English.

Accommodation:

All cities, where a Thomas More campus is located, have suitable student accommodation. Students can rent a room in a private student house or share an apartment with other students. The rental price of a furnished student room differs from city to city with an average of 300 EUR/month . 'Studios' or apartments are more expensive. Costs for water, electricity supplies and heating are usually not included in this price. Bed linen and towels are not provided by the landlord, cooking utensils not always.

It is advised all students start looking for accommodation at an early stage.

If you are selected to study at Thomas More you will be contacted by the student services STIP to assist you in your search for housing.

They will ask you to complete the online housing form for Antwerp, Mechelen or Kempen.




